Fast facts about the Redwood Falls Rotary Club:

1. Rotary meets every Monday (except legal holidays) at 12:05 p.m. at the Redwood Falls Legion Club. Rotarians are expected to attend at least 60% of club meetings.
2. Rotary dues are \$29 per quarter and \$8.55 per week for meals. The club treasurer sends you an invoice quarterly. Invoices are typically about \$135.00 per quarter.
3. In order to encourage attendance, members are invoiced for all meals regardless of attendance. The revenue collected from absent Rotarians is spent on the meals of the program presenters, Student Rotarians, and potential members visiting the Club.
4. When Rotarians miss a meeting they are encouraged to "make up" by visiting a club in another city. When a Rotarian presents proof of the visit to the club treasurer his/her invoice is reduced by \$8.55 since it is assumed he/she paid for lunch while visiting the other club.
5. In recent years club service projects have included donations to local and international projects and hands-on work such as roadside cleanup and park plantings.
6. All Rotarians are expected to assist with two major fundraisers: The Annual Pancake Fly-in Breakfast held at the airport on the 4th Sunday in June, and the Rose Sale in October. Periodically other fundraisers are planned and Rotarians are asked to participate in these events as well.
7. Every Rotarian is encouraged to make a tax-deductible contribution (of any amount) to the Rotary Foundation every year. When a Rotarian has donated a cumulative total of \$1000, he/she is named a Paul Harris Fellow, a designation named for the founder of Rotary.

Fast facts about Rotary International:

- Rotary is a volunteer organization of 1.2 million business and professional leaders united worldwide to provide humanitarian service and help build good will and peace. About 32,000+ Rotary clubs in more than 200 countries conduct projects to address today's challenges – including illiteracy, disease, hunger, poverty, and lack of clean water.
- As the world's largest private provider of International Scholarships, the Rotary Foundation helps more than 1,000 students annually to study abroad and serve as cultural ambassadors. Our Club hosts high school exchange students and also teams of young adults from other countries as part of our Foundation activities.
- Rotary International is working with the World Health Organization, UNICEF, and the US Centers for Disease Control to eradicate polio worldwide. When this project is completed, Rotary club members will have contributed \$850 million to immunize more than two billion children in 122 countries.
